O.T. Redemption: Terms and Observations

- ♦ **Ga'al** (Hebrew): to **redeem**, avenger, ransom, to redeem by payment from slavery, to redeem/buy back through payment of a price (**BDB**, **Strong**, **LBD**)
- ♦ Padah (Hebrew): to ransom, redeem, rescue, deliver, to release, preserve (BDB, Strong)
- ♦ Observations:
 - ♦ Redemption comes in the form of "buying back" or paying a ransom.
 - ♦ Redemption is also rescuing, dehhlivering, and freeing one from bondage and/or calamity with no price being paid Deut. 7:8

N.T. Redemption: Terms

- ♦ Lytroo (verb): ransom (lit. or fig.), redeem; to liberate by payment of ransom; to set free, redeem, rescue someone (Strong; Thayer; BDAG)
- **Exagorazo** (verb): to ransom, fig. to *rescue* from loss, redeem; to redeem by payment of a price to recover from the power of another; *deliver* someone (**Strong**; **Thayer**; **BDAG**)
- Peripoieo (verb): acquire (buy), purchase; to get for oneself, purchase, to gain; to save or preserve for oneself, to preserve one's life (Strong; Thayer; BDAG)

N.T. Redemption: Observations

- ♦ Note the similarities in meaning of O.T. and N.T. words
- ♦ Biblical redemption is the whole of God's actions to save/free us from the bondage and calamity of our sin.
 - ♦ Redeemed by the price of Christ's blood 1 Pet. 1:18-19
 - ♦ Redemption is our **justification** Rom. 3:24
 - ♦ Redemption is our **deliverance** Col. 1:13-14
 - ♦ Redemption is our freedom/deliverance from the curse of the Law Gal. 3:13; Rom. 7:6
 - ♦ Redemption is our forgiveness Eph. 1:7
 - ♦ Redemption is our **freedom from living in sin** − Titus 2:14

Shadows of Redemption: Noah and Grace

- ♦ Noah was saved by grace Gen. 6:5-8
 - ♦ The wickedness of the world brought its destruction 6:5-7
 - ♦ Noah found grace in God's eyes! 6:8
- Why did Noah find grace while the world was condemned?
 - ♦ Contrary to modern thought, Noah found grace because he sought to live a righteous life despite the world's evil Gen. 6:9, 5-7, 11
 - ♦ Noah was redeemed/saved from calamity in the ark because he lived righteously despite no one else doing so − Gen. 7:1; Ezek. 14:14
 - ♦ Noah wasn't sinless, but dealt with his sins as a righteous person would—as God prescribed Gen. 4:3-4; Heb. 11:4

Shadows of Redemption: Noah and Faith

- ♦ We are saved by grace through faith Eph. 2:8-9
- ♦ Noah was saved by grace through faith Gen. 6:8; Heb. 11:7
 - ♦ By faith Noah obeyed God's instructions (given by grace) to build an ark to save his household, showing saving faith is obedient faith Gen. 6:14, 22, 7:1
- ♦ God's grace to redeem/save is given to those who have a good heart willing to hear, believe, and obey God's word Lk. 8:15; Heb. 5:8-9; Rom. 6:17-18; 2 Thess. 1:8-9

Shadows of Redemption: Noah and Baptism

- ♦ Noah's salvation in the ark through water is a shadow of our salvation through water in baptism 1 Pet. 3:20-21
- ♦ Noah by faith obeyed God and built the ark by which He and his family were saved 3:20
- ♦ Corresponding to that, we are saved by obeying God in being baptized in water 3:21
 - ♦ People don't like it, but baptism is a command to be obeyed to be saved Acts 2:38; 10:48
 - ♦ Baptism removes the spiritual dirt of sin that corrupts the conscience
 - ♦ As Noah acted in faith by building the ark, so baptism is an act of faith in God's work to save us Col. 2:12; Rom. 6:3-4
