# Moses and Jesus - Redeemers 

Moses and Jesus...

## Redecmers of Those in Borndrge

$\diamond$ Moses: Sent to redeem Israel enslaved in Egypt - Ex. 3:7-8, 10
$\diamond$ Moses was sent with miraculous signs as credentials for belief - Ex. 4:1-5
$\diamond$ When the people complained, Moses questioned God's plan - Ex. 5:22-23; 6:1-9
$\diamond$ God provided deliverance through Moses; but most were lost in the wilderness for unbelief - Jer. 32:20-22; Heb. 3:16-19
$\diamond$ Jesus: Sent to redeem Israel and the world from the bondage of sin
$\diamond$ This was Jesus singular purpose - Mt. 1:20-21; Lk. 19:10; 1 Tim. 1:15
$\diamond$ Jesus came with miracles to prove he was the Messiah - Jn. 1:29; Mt. 11:2-6
$\diamond$ Though rejected like Moses, Jesus knew he would be rejected as part of God's plan - Jn. 12:37-38; Mt. 16:21-23
$\diamond$ God provided redemption through Jesus, but most of Israel was lost in unbelief Mt. 23:37-38; Rom. 9:27; 11:5

# Moses and Jesus - Lawgivers 

## Moses as the Lawgiver for Israel

$\diamond$ God called Moses to the Mountain to reveal the Law - Ex. 24:12
$\diamond$ Moses received glory from God
$\diamond$ After leaving the mountain his face glowed - Ex. 24:29
$\diamond$ That glory faded - 2 Cor. 3:7, 13

$\diamond$ God gave this law to Moses "face to face," making him one of the greatest of the prophets - Num. 12:6-9; Deut. 34:10-12
$\diamond$ Moses was not allowed to see God's face - Ex. 33:21-23

## Jesus ad Lawgine io Infinitely Grater

$\diamond$ Though God spoke through both, Jesus is God's eternally glorious SON Heb. 1:1-4; 3:5-6
$\diamond$ Though both received their words from the Father, Jesus is God, abides with God, and sees God's face - Jn. 14:24; 1:1-2; Heb. 1:3
$\diamond$ Though both revealed God's will, Jesus brought grace and truth - Jn. 1:17.
$\diamond$ Moses' law, though having grace, focused on legal decree and precedent - Rom. 15:4
$\diamond$ The N.T., though having legal qualities, is not to be viewed as a system of law, but a relationship by grace through Christ - 1 Cor. 9:21; Rom. 6:12-16; Rom. 8:2
$\diamond$ Though both were lawgivers, Jesus is the way, the truth, and the life - Jn. 14:3-6
$\diamond$ Jesus' life and death are the way to God
$\diamond$ He is the truth because His life embodied the truth about the God
$\diamond$ He is the life because He offers to all eternal life - Jn. 5:26; 11:25
