Moses and Jesus...

### Redeemers of Those in Bondage

- ♦ Moses: Sent to redeem Israel enslaved in **Egypt** Ex. 3:7-8, 10
  - ♦ Moses was sent with miraculous signs as credentials for belief Ex. 4:1-5
  - ♦ When the people complained, Moses questioned God's plan Ex. 5:22-23; 6:1-9
  - ♦ God provided deliverance through Moses; but most were lost in the wilderness for unbelief Jer. 32:20-22; Heb. 3:16-19
- ♦ Jesus: Sent to redeem Israel and the world from the bondage of sin
  - ♦ This was Jesus singular purpose Mt. 1:20-21; Lk. 19:10; 1 Tim. 1:15
  - ♦ Jesus came with miracles to prove he was the Messiah Jn. 1:29; Mt. 11:2-6
  - ♦ Though rejected like Moses, Jesus knew he would be rejected as part of God's plan
    Jn. 12:37-38; Mt. 16:21-23
  - ♦ God provided redemption through Jesus, but most of Israel was lost in unbelief Mt. 23:37-38; Rom. 9:27; 11:5

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# Moses and Jesus - Lawgivers

## Moses as the Lawgiver for Israel

♦ God called Moses to the Mountain to reveal the Law – Ex. 24:12

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- Moses received glory from God
  - ♦ After leaving the mountain his face glowed Ex. 24:29
  - ♦ That glory faded 2 Cor. 3:7, 13
- ♦ God gave this law to Moses "face to face," making him one of the greatest of the prophets Num. 12:6-9; Deut. 34:10-12
- ♦ Moses was **not allowed** to see God's face Ex. 33:21-23

## Jesus as Lawgiver is Infinitely Greater

- ♦ Though God spoke through both, Jesus is God's **eternally glorious SON** Heb. 1:1-4; 3:5-6
- ♦ Though both received their words from the Father, Jesus is God, abides with God, and sees God's face Jn. 14:24; 1:1-2; Heb. 1:3
- ♦ Though both revealed God's will, Jesus brought grace and truth Jn. 1:17.
  - ♦ Moses' law, though having grace, *focused* on legal decree and precedent Rom. 15:4
  - ♦ The N.T., though having legal qualities, is not to be viewed as a *system of law*, but a relationship by grace through Christ − 1 Cor. 9:21; Rom. 6:12-16; Rom. 8:2
- ♦ Though both were lawgivers, Jesus is **the way**, **the truth**, and **the life** Jn. 14:3-6
  - ♦ Jesus' life and death are the way to God
  - ♦ He is **the truth** because His life embodied the truth about the God
  - ♦ He is **the life** because He offers to all eternal life Jn. 5:26; 11:25

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
