Salvation Defined

Salvation: Old Testament

Yasha/Yesha

- Deliverance, salvation, rescue, safety, welfare, victory
- Psalms 18:2-3; Isa. 12:1-2

Teshua

- Deliverance, spiritual salvation
- Psalms 51:9-12

Salvation: New Testament

Soteria

- Deliverance, preservation, safety
- Salvation (through the Messiah)
- Luke 19:9-10

Sozo/Diasozo

- To save, keep safe, rescue
- Physical Luke 18:42
- Spiritual Matt. 1:21; Jn. 3:17; 1 Pet. 3:20-21

Salvation is Important Because God is Holy

God's Holiness

- Is exalted in heaven Isa. 6:1-3; Rev. 4:8; 1
 Jn. 1:5
- Demands holiness Psa. 119:172; 1 Pet.
 1:14-16; 1 Jn. 3:7
- Will judge the world Jn. 16:7-8; Acts 17:30-31; Rom. 2:5-8; 2 Thess. 1:6-8
- Is why the world despises Him Rom. 1:18-19, 25
- Is why we have a problem Isa. 6:5

Salvation is Important Because We are Sinners

Our Sin

- Is not God's fault.
 - God made us upright Eccl. 7:29
 - Jesus spoke of the purity in which we are born Matt. 18:2-3
- Is the result of using our freedom for self and sin
 - Our sin separates us from God Isa. 59:1-2
 - Our sin earns "death" Rom. 3:9, 23; 6:23
 - Our condemnation is just Rom. 1:28-32

Conclusion

- Salvation importance becomes clear when our predicament becomes clear.
 - God is holy and He will judge us
 - Our lives are not holy and deserve condemnation
- You do not have to remain unsaved!
 - God has given you a gift in Christ that saves Rom. 6:23
 - There is no condemnation for those in Christ Rom. 8:1-2
