

Israel

180-200 miles long and covered only 8000-10,000 sq. miles.




New Testament Israel

- 180-200 miles long and covered only 8000-10,000 sq. miles.
- The miracles of Jesus' Galilean ministry took place in an area 8-10 miles long at the northern end of the Sea of Galilee
 - This would compare to the area of Cookeville.
 - 31+ instances of a miracle with multiple witnesses who were **not disciples**
 - 22 of these instances claim **crowds** were present, 11 being **large crowds**.
 - 6 additional accounts (in Matthew alone) claim Jesus did numerous miracles before very large crowds.
 - On two occasions 4000/5000 12,000/15,000 people experienced being miraculously fed.

New Testament Israel

- 180-200 miles long and covered only 8000-10,000 sq. miles.
- The miracles of Jesus' Galilean ministry took place in an area 8-10 miles long at the northern end of the Sea of Galilee
 - This would Jesus performed 100's, even
 - 31+ instan
 22 of these

 - On two occasions 4000/5000 12,000/15,000 people experienced being miraculously fed.




Jesus' Miracles In/Near Jerusalem

• Jerusalem covered less than 1 sq. mile, with a population of 25,000 - 50,000

Healing at the Pool of Bethesda

- Jn. 5:1-18
- During a feast—many Jews present
- Specific place
- Specific person lame 38 years
- Healed man was seen openly by a great many Jews
- Healed man was accused of breaking Sabbath for carrying his pallet
- Healed man entered the temple
- Jews persecuted Jesus for breaking Sabbath and blasphemy





Healing at the Pool of Bethesda

- Jn. 5:1-18
- During a feast—many Jews present
- Specific place

Why would a fabricated miracle like this ever be believed?

- Healed man was accused of breaking Sabbath for carrying his pallet
- Healed man entered the temple
- Jews persecuted Jesus for breaking Sabbath and blasphemy





Healing Outside the Temple

- Jn. 8:58-9:11
- Very public miracle
- Involved a man known by a great number of people as the blind man who begged by the temple

Was there or was there not such a blind beggar healed by Jesus?

Raising Lazarus at Bethany

- Jn. 11:1-3, 17-19, 38-48
- Witnessed by many Jews
- Involved a man known by many to have died and was dead for four days.
- Same group of people saw him raised from the dead completely whole
- Some believed and others went and told the Pharisees
- Lazarus became famous and crowds came to see him – Jn. 12:9-11



Raising Lazarus at Bethany

- Jn. 11:1-3, 17-19, 38-48
- Witnessed by many Jews
- Involved a man known by many to have
 Was there a Lazarus, and was
 he raised from the dead?
 Acts 2:22
- Some believed and others went and told the Pharisees
- Lazarus became famous and crowds came to see him – Jn. 12:9-11



We Can Trust The Bible's Record of Jesus' Miracles

- How could the apostles have hoped to succeed in lying about Jesus...
 - Performing 100's+ of prominent miracles before tens of thousands of people in an area only 8-10 miles long?
 - Performing prominent miracles in Jerusalem and Bethany?
- The apostles never recanted despite suffering and dying for their testimony – 2 Pet. 1:16-18; 1 Jn. 1:1-3
- There are secular references to Jesus' miracles (i.e., Josephus, Babylonian Talmud)
