OUR VICTIMHOOD CULTURE

WHAT IT IS

- Culture a specific set of ideas, rules, and social behavior of a particular group
- Defined and applied:
 - Cambridge dictionary "the condition of having been hurt, damaged, or made to suffer, especially when you want others to feel sorry or you...or to use it as an excuse for something"
 - Victimhood culture is about blaming others while refusing to assign responsibility or accept accountability for one's actions.

OTHER DISTURBING FACTS

- Those who disagree are considered victimizers and must be silenced
- Encourages constant fault-finding and rage at any perceived offense or divergence from their approved opinions
- Categorizes people "privilege," which is based on race and gender
- Some attempt to justify it biblically Ex. 20:5-6

THE BIBLE AND VICTIMHOOD CULTURE

IS GOD RESPONSIBLE?

- Blaming God for one's sinful actions is not new – Eccl. 1:9; Gen. 3:9-13
- God is not responsible Exodus 20:5-6
 - "Visiting" is about consequences, not character or behavior
 - Some might cry "foul!"

PROOF OF MY CONCLUSION

- God is not responsible for sinful conduct Jas. 1:13-15
- The "visiting" of the fathers' sins did not force the children to act sinfully – Psa. 95:7-10; Deut. 24:16; Heb. 3:12-19
- God refused to allow the victimhood culture
 - Jeremiah addressed it Jer. 31:29; 16:1-13; 31:29-30
 - Ezekiel addressed it Ezek. 18

MORE BIBLICAL PROBLEMS WITH VICTIMHOOD CULTURE

Fault-finding and enraged attacks on one's "enemies" are contrary to Christ's love – I Cor. 13:4-7; Rom. 12:14, 17-21

Determining the value of others based on race and gender is contrary to God's will – 1 Pet. 23:17; Gal. 3:26-28

We must live with accountability

- Our thoughts and actions will be judged 2 Cor. 5:10;
 Rom. 2:5-8
- God will not be mocked concerning this Gal. 6:7-8

APPLICATIONS

- Children will face the consequences of their parents' actions
 - Though not held guilty, children can suffer physically for the sins of the parents.
 - Children can suffer spiritually for their parents' sin.
 - Children can be abundantly blessed for their parents' righteousness – Ex. 20:6
