## Understanding the Bible

- Our ability to understand God's word is a "given."
  - Israel was taught God's law to understand Neb. 8:2-3, 8
  - We understand by reading Eph. 3:2-4
  - God commands us to understand Eph. 5:15-17
- That we can understand implies we understand it alike.
  - If communication is possible, a common understanding is possible.
  - of God's word is possible Eph. 3:6; Mt. 16:4-12

## Revelation's Purpose Demands Common Understanding

- ∘ Revelation is so we can know the truth − 1 Cor. 2:7-13
  - o The apostles preach what was given them so all could "know the things freely given to us by God"
  - ∘ That we can know the truth means we can know the same things 1 Tim. 4:1-5
- ∘ God's word is to reprove and correct 2 Tim. 3:16-17
  - This is not possible without a common understanding of God's word
  - Christians did correct others concerning doctrine –
     Acts 18:24-26

## What is Needed for Common Understanding?

- ∘ Honest and good hearts Lk. 8:15
- ° Proper attitudes toward the Scriptures and its authority 1 Cor. 4:6
- ∘ Diligence in their efforts to find the truth − 2 Tim. 2:15; Acts 17:11; 2 Pet. 3:16
- ° Willingness to accept all that God's word says on a subject Psa. 119:160; Mt. 7:7; Jas. 1:6; 1 Jn. 5:14
- Willingness to reject any interpretation of scripture that contradicts the plain teaching of other scripture Mt. 4:5-7
